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Although taxonomists have suggested several theories on the origin of *Prunus yedoensis*, there is no agreement yet. Three senarios are represented:

1) hybridization, 2) it is native to the Idz pennisula in Japan, and 3) it is native to Mt. Halla in Korea. To define the taxonomic problems of *P. yedoensis* and pursue the phylogeny, we performed a morphological review, anatomy by LM and SEM, RAPDs and nrDNA ITS sequence analyses. Also, phenetic and cladistic analyses were performed based on the results. We found 33 previously unknown individuals of *P. yedoensis* along with three ones which had been already reported from Mt. Halla, conserved as National Monument. Based on the results, we suggest the following: 1) It is confirmed that the origin of *P. yedoensis* is Mt. Halla on Cheju Isl., 2) we could not detect any evidence that *P. yedoensis* is a hybrid between nearby species, 3) *P. yedoensis* has an independent evolutionary history and is the distingushable from other species, and 4) *P. pendula* might be the most closely related species to *P. yedoensis*.
