supports the idea that endogenous PcG acts at the early stages of embryogenesis in Xenopus.

Study on the Role of Yin Yang 1 (YY1), a Vertebrate Polycomb Group (PcG) Gene in Xenopus Embryogenesis

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Yang 1 (YY1) is a zinc finger-containing transcription factor that can act as a transcriptional repressor, an activator, or an initiator element-binding protein. This is a homolog of the Drosophila Polycomb group (PcG) gene pleiohomeotic (pho). To investigate the role of YY1 in early development of vertebrate, we analyzed the expression pattern of this gene using whole mount in situ hybridization and performed the gain-of-function study by YY1 sense RNA microinjection. Xenopus YY1 mRNA expresses in ubiquitous fashion during embryogenesis with weak staining in CNS, tail tip and protodeum. The sense YY1 RNA-injected embryos exhibit distortion of axis and gastrulation defects, suggesting that YY1 may have a role during Xenopus embryogenesis.
