Enhancement of Low Temperature Critical Current Density of MgB₂ Thin Films by Au Coating

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We measured the superconducting critical current densities (J_c) from the magnetization hysteresis (M-H) loop while depositing the gold on top of the MgB₂ thin film. The purpose of this experiment is whether the vortex avalanche phenomena which suppress the J_c for low temperature (T < 15 K) and low field (H = 1000 Oe) can be cured by gold deposition. This avalanche called flux noise has been headache for the application of the MgB₂ thin films. As increasing the thickness of Au film, fortunately, the flux noise in the M-H loop is suppressed and finally disappears when thickness of the gold becomes 2.55 μ m. From this experiment, the obstacles of the application of MgB₂ thin film are completely overcome.
