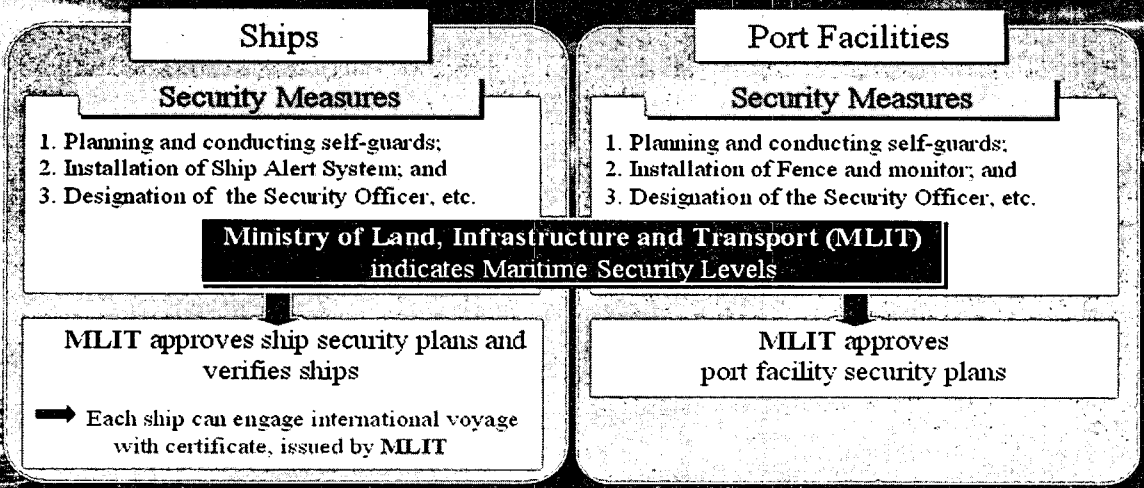

Law for the security of ships and of port facilities



Control the ships entering into ports

- ◆ To oblige the ships, coming from foreign countries, to send information to Japan Coast Guard (JCG) prior to entry into port.
 - ◆ To request the ships to send additional information and visit and board, if these additional requests of steps are necessary.
 - ◆ If the ship denied the additional requests, or if the ship has obvious threat, which may affect on port facilities and there is no effective measure.
- JCG may take steps, such as denial of entry into port.

Control the ships entering into port

JCG's procedure

- 1. Requirement of the Ship Security Information by 24 hours before entry into port**
Additional information can be required, if necessary
- 2. Assessment of the Ship's Compliance and; Judgment of the necessity on boarding check**
- 3. Further Assessment of the Ship's Compliance**
↓ *If clear ground found*
Further Assessment of the immediate threat
Search person or thing with fear of danger
- 4. Appropriate measures including denial of entry into port**
when boarding is refused also, denial of entry into port
