

Sex knowledge, Sexual Attitudes and Behaviors of Collage Students

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1. INTRODUCTION

Life-cycle phase of the college students in the age of adolescence and early adulthood in its review of the physical completion of the growth period should be devoted to study and still increasing industrialization, extended higher education and marriage age is higher for prolonged periods, and the social, psychological, and economic responsibilities of sexual behavior as an adult is not the time to be allowed[1]. However, a long period of time required to suppress their sexual desires been plagued school entrance exam oriented on services for young people college environment relatively free life through various activities while experiencing a wide range of interpersonal relationships when sexual activity is becoming actives as well. Now more than ever before in the nation's college students about sex is socially acceptable to live in a high age.[2][5] In the corret understanding and accurate knowledge about sex and sexual problems may help prevent and effectively deal with a more satisfying, as well as a responsible adult human being to engage in sexual activity is an important factor[3], and the college of sexual knowledge for improving the provision of sex education current level of knowledge of sex and gender in order to identify knowledge must precede it[4].

2. METHOD

The research subjects of this study were 144 students of college and the data were collected from December 2013 by single 92 item sexual questionnaire. Data was analyzed using descriptive statistics, t-test, ANOVA, and Pearson correlation. The result of this study may be summarized as follows.

2.1. Research tools

2.1.1 Sex knowledge

Knowledge of gender Parcel, Lettman and Meyers(1979) Tools and Lee(1994) the tools, Kye(1998) of the tool, Sung(2000) of the tool Jeon(2004) is modified, supplemented were measured using a tool was composed of 35 questionnaire

2.1.2 Sex attitude

Attitude is Jeon(2004) were measured using a tool Likert type scale consists of 25 questionnaire.

2.1.3 Sexual Behavior

Sexual behavior is sex-related media contact measurement tools per month contact number with or without experience, whether the experience of relationship, relationship my depth, presence of sexual experience, gender and sexual problem solved or not worry about how to share, consisting of multiple choice questionnaire was 12.

3. RESULTS

The analysis of the relationship between sexual knowledge, attitudes and behaviors, this study revealed that sexual knowledge and sexual attitudes of college students have a correlation($r=.259$, $p=.002$). stuennds experience of intercourse did not influence their sexual knowledge($r=.090$, $p=.281$), but did influence their sexual attitudes. Also sexual attitudes did influence sexual media of an adult movie($r=-.182$, $p=.029$), sexual books($r=-.201$, $p=.015$), dating($r=-.170$, $p=.041$). there was a correlation between sexual knowledge, attitudes and behaviors.
