### Human Use for Natural Caves

# 1. Use for the site of a prehistoric settlement

A cave can protect us from a foreign invasion as well as rain and wind. Also, its internal temperature can be constantly kept all the year round. Thereby it is well known that it was used for a dwelling site of our ancestors. However, this fact is just limited around the entrance of the cave. #### 5. Use of cave sediment

Cave sediment is used for ornaments in all parts of the world. In China, rocks mined from caves are used for medicines to reinforce human muscle and marrow.

By using the atmosphere of the cave which treasures natural mysteries and the splendor of an underground palace and also an underground pandemonium, many tourist caves have been developing. From early twentieth centuries, the world have given impetus to develop tourist caves.

# 7. Use for a learning site of natural observation

Recently, caves of treasuring perpetual mysteries have been developed and used for a learning site of natural observation. Caves were a site of a prehistoric settlement. Thereby they have an important academic value in the human archeology side, for an observation place of geology and topography which were little suffered from weathering and erosion, and for a dwelling site of underground creatures thanks to the special environment such as darkness,

constant temperature, and constant humidity.

## 8. Use of cave environment

The use of cave is dependent upon its internal environment. However, the development of its underground water is also highlighted for water-power generation, cultivating water sources, city water supply sources, including spring water, that is, soda and hot spring water.
